

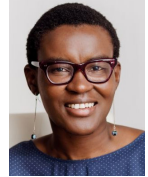


Public Private Partnerships (PPPs) Panel Discussion

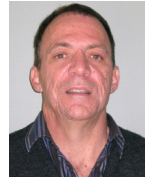
